This notice is to inform the residents of Oroville that they have until April 15, 2022 to remedy any issues in regards to the following Oroville Municipal Codes:

OMC 8.08 (public nuisances), OMC 8.10 (litter control), OMC 8.12 (garbage regulations), OMC 8.16 (automobile hunks), OMC 9.24 (condemnation of buildings), OMC 9.64 (graffiti nuisance), and OMC (10.08 (parking regulations).

1) On April 15, 2022, the Oroville Police Department will begin issuing citations, and or impounding hulk, junk or inoperable or unregistered vehicles on city right of way. Citations may also be issued for residences found to be out of compliance with the OMC regarding junk vehicles, debris, or overgrowth issues that are in violation of the above-mentioned OMC's.

Enforcement will start on April 15, 2022 with a deliberate procession through the entire city. It is well documented that debris, junk, abandoned vehicles, overgrown or abandoned properties lead to an increase in criminal activity. We are making every effort to align the city wide clean up day with this timeline.
