

Regular Council Meeting of November 4, 2025

Present were: Mayor Naillon, Councilmembers Shaw, Marthaller and Hart.

Absent: Councilmembers Werner and Moser.

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Naillon. Pledge of Allegiance given. Copies of the October 21st council meeting minutes were read and approved.

Motion by Shaw and second by Marthaller the vouchers \$29,092.81, #35865-35888, be paid, manual checks \$1,865.80, Park Account EFT #990568, Checking Account EFT #990510, Checking Account #35744-35746, 35821-35822, be paid and the October 31, 2025 payroll of \$93,952.00, #35823-35864, Direct Deposit Run, EFT #202540-202541, be approved; motion carried unanimously.

Denise Dhane attended the meeting to present Fire Chief Rawley with a check for \$8,000 from community donations. Dhane explained involvement by Cindy Wallitner and the Oroville Eagles Auxiliary #3865 in organizing the fund raising events and expressed deep appreciation for the Oroville Community and their support of the Fire Department; discussed additional funds they hope to receive for the department. Dhane presented the check to Fire Chief Rawley. Fire Chief Rawley thanked Dhane and everyone involved in supporting the Fire Department, the support is greatly appreciated.

Public Hearing on the 2026 City Property Tax Revenues (Ad Valorem). Ordinance #951 allows for an increase in the regular property tax levy to be collected in 2026; the increase over last year is \$3,356.71. 2026 levy amount will be \$339,027.92. Motion by Hart and second by Shaw that Ordinance #951 be adopted as read; motion carried unanimously.

Civil Service reappointment request received for reappointment of Joe King for an additional 6 year term. Motion by Shaw, second by Marthaller that Mayor Naillon be authorized to reappoint Joe King to the Civil Service Commission; motion carried unanimously. Mayor Naillon expressed his appreciation for King's service to the City.

Retirement letter received from Lynn Chapman from the Oroville Streetscape and the Oroville Tree Board; Mayor Naillon expressed appreciation for Chapman and all that she has done for the community.

Superintendent Thompson discussed the Well 4 repairs that are needed. Thompson received a quote from Irrigation Technologies to pull the pump and make the needed repairs; Thompson stated that those repairs will be completed during the winter when usage of Well 4 is at its lowest.

Department Head Updates

Superintendent Thompson stated that the crew removed the 2 trees on Main Street and took out the section of sidewalk on Central Avenue that will be replaced by the property owner as previously discussed.

Police Chief Hirst stated that property damage has occurred at the Old Texaco Station and he anticipates that the damage to that property will continue until the property owner addresses all of the issues with the building.

Fire Chief Rawley stated that the department is running smoothly and he has nothing new to report.

Clerk Denney reminded everyone of the upcoming budget workshop to be held Wednesday, November 12th at 4:30 pm.

Councilmember Shaw stated that the 2026 AWC Center for Quality Communities scholarships are now open for nominations and she requested permission to work on the program again this year. Motion by Hart, second by Marthaller that Shaw work on the program again this year; motion carried unanimously. Mayor and Council thanked Shaw for taking on the project.

Susan Cline stated that the Food Pantry is looking for a new location that keeps their services on the ground level; discussed difficulties with the stairs at the current location.

As there being no further business, meeting adjourned at 7:17 pm by Mayor Naillon.
